On March 27 th , in the middle of the night, Colin went missing from his language school. A search ensued. On April 4 th , Colin was found dead. Russian officials maintained that Alex had used drugs, wandered off and died from exposure, while Alex’s family was skeptical. For one thing, along with organizations like Greenpeace, Colin had participated in environmental peace protests. In the months before his death, he had been sent a warning letter by local authorities to stop his participation. Colin’s family asked the U.S. State Department for help to learn the truth. They were told, “[The State Department has] no power to conduct investigations on Russian territory.” The family hired an independent team of US-based forensic scientists who found suspicious marks on Colin’s body and no evidence of drugs. Forensic experts concluded that there was	Colin was interested in languages, culture, travel and nature. He had attended Columbia College and University of Missouri. His interests took him to Siberia, where Colin became fluent in Russian. He also spoke Spanish and was learning Icelandic and Japanese. While in Russia, Colin volunteered with environmental groups in the Lake Baikal region. These groups were creating hiking trails and working to protect the area from development. Colin’s goal was a career in diplomacy. He was nearing his undergrad completion and was to attend graduate school at Cornell.

Over the next day, twenty hostages were killed, also two restaurant employees, two policeman, and five terrorists. Tarishi, Abinta and Faraaz took shelter in a bathroom. Tarishi called her father and said, “They are killing everyone here.
