They were touring Bolivia with another family. The driver of their vehicle was traveling too fast for road conditions, when he slammed into another vehicle. Family members were notified that Tamar had sustained broken bones and a collapsed lung, but that she was in stable condition and receiving medical care. Tamar's father traveled to Bolivia. When he arrived he realized the seriousness of Tamar's condition and made arrangements to transport his daughter. Jared was lead student hiker when he slipped from an icy trail and fell 500 feet. The next day, hikers located his body. Investigators concluded that Jared had gotten ahead of his group, made a navigational error and ended up on a steeper trail. He “may have tried to descend below cloud to get a visual reference” and lost his footing. In the aftermath of Jared’s death, family described how hurtful it was to read post-mortem media references to him as a “thrill seeker” and “adrenaline junkie.” His father noted, “It wasn’t like [Jared] didn’t prepare...it was that type of navigational error that happens,” adding, “he loved the outdoors...[and] just wanted to feel the breeze, take in...beauty of the blue skies and...all the landscape.” Jared’s sister said that her brother “potentially saved someone else from slipping off that cliff.”</p> <p>http://www.nydailynews.com/news/national/arizona-state-</p>	<p>sister described him as, “such a happy person,” “loved by so many people.”</p>
