Authorities found two injured men there, as well. The next day, German police arrested a suspect, Thomas R. Allegedly, he had briefly dated Mieke, but after she stopped seeing him, he'd begun to stalk her, including placing a tracker on her bike. On the day Mieke was killed, TR threw an incendiary device into the apartment building, causing the fire-related injuries to two men. During the pandemonium, the suspect got into the building and stabbed Mieke.
